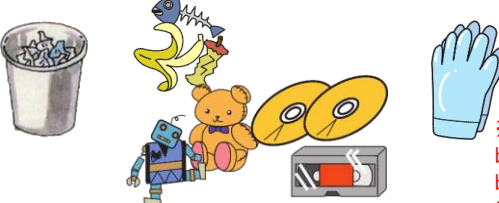
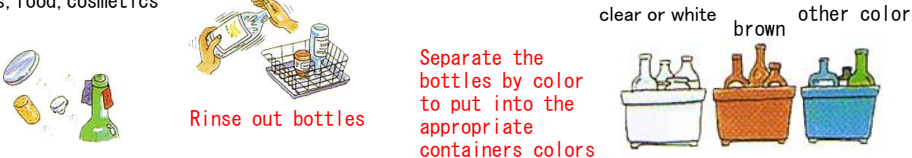
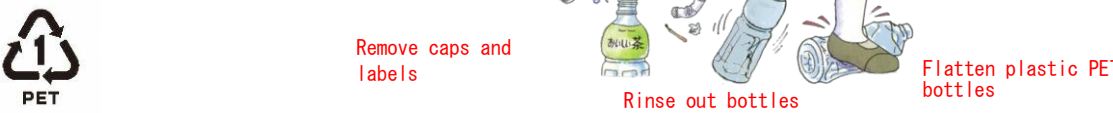
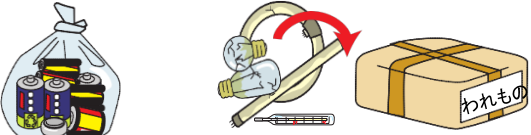


Rules of Disposal at Garbage Collection Sites

※Let's Work Together to Keep Our Town Clean!

Category	Main items	The rules
Burnable Garbage 	●Kitchen waste, Paper waste ●Wood, Branches ●Stuffed toy ●Plastic items without the ♻️ mark ●Video tapes, Cassette tapes ●CD, MD, DVD  ※The maximum size for plastic bags is 45 liters. Any garbage bigger than that is collected as Oversized Garbage.	• Please use clear or white translucent bags. • Dispose of food waste by thoroughly draining excess water, removing air from the plastic bag, and securely tying the opening. • Items that are easy to prick your hands on, such as thorny branches or bamboo skewers, should be clearly labeled as such and wrapped in paper or otherwise handled safely before being thrown out. • If metal parts are included, place it in the non-burnable garbage. • Dispose of cooking oil by soaking it into old cloth or newspaper, or solidifying it with a solidifying agent.
Plastic Containers and Packaging 	●Plastic, Vinyl, Rubber, Styrofoam ●Caps and labels of PET bottles ●Plastic containers and wrappings with the plastic identification mark ♻️ ●Trays 	• Please place plastic in a clear or white translucent bag. • Items without a plastic label ♻️ should be placed in the burnable garbage. • Empty food containers and bags completely, then rinse them lightly. Plastic containers and packaging “Container” refers to items that hold products (including bags), while “packaging” refers to items that wrap products. This term specifically denotes plastic containers and packaging that become unnecessary after the contents have been removed or used up.
Glass Bottles 	★Glass bottles for beverages, food, cosmetics and oral medication Take off the cap or cork  Rinse out bottles Separate the bottles by color to put into the appropriate containers colors	• “Milky white or white bottles,” “ceramic bottles,” and “heat-resistant glass products” are classified as non-combustible waste. • Sort bottles by color and place them in the corresponding containers. (Do not put bottles in bags.) • Remove all contents and rinse lightly. • Beer bottles and one-liter bottles should be returned to the place of purchase whenever possible.
Cans 	★Cans for beverages and food ★Spray cans ★Cassette fuel canisters(used up with no contents remaining!) ※Pots and frying pans are Non-burnable Garbage  Rinse the inside and flatten the can Use all of the contents of the can	• Includes cans that contained beverages such as juice or beer and canned goods, as well as spray cans and cassette gas cylinders. • To ensure recyclability, remove all contents and rinse lightly before disposal. • Place items directly into the recycling bin without using bags.
Non-burnable Garbage 	★Ceramics ★Pans, Frying pans ★Umbrellas, Electric bulbs, Scissors ★Small home appliances ★Disposable lighters  ※The maximum size for plastic bags is 45 liters. Any garbage bigger than that is collected as Oversized	• When using bags to organize small items, please use clear or white translucent bags. • Always remove batteries or rechargeable batteries from products before disposal. • Completely use lighters before throwing them away. • Wood scraps must be cut to a length under 40 cm and a thickness between 5 cm and 15 cm, then securely bundled for disposal. • Wrap knives and other sharp objects, light bulbs, dishes, and other fragile items in old newspapers. Label each bundle as “はもの” (knives) or “われもの” (Fragile items) before disposal.
Recyclable Garbage 	★Newspapers ★Cardboard ★Old clothes and fabrics ★Magazines ★Paper Cartons  Paper with this mark Used papers and clothes are recyclable and valuable resources	• Sort recyclables by material type, then tie them into bundles or place them in bags for disposal. • Paper cartons for beverages such as alcohol, where the inside is silver-coated or laminated with film, cannot be recycled and should be disposed of as “Burnable Garbage.” • Cut grass and leaves to a length of under 100 cm and a diameter of under 15 cm, then bundle them securely before disposal. • Place used clothing in clear or white translucent bags.
Oversized Garbage 	★Large Furniture ★Large-sized electrical appliances (No collection for specified determined items. See Notice※) ★Bicycles 	Oversized garbage is collected door-to-door by appointment only (fees apply). Those wishing to arrange collection should apply through the Inagawa Town Clean Center. 072-768-1062
PET Bottles 	★PET bottles with the PET recycle mark  Remove caps and labels Rinse out bottles Flatten plastic PET bottles	• Place PET bottles directly into the trash net container without using a bag. • Remove all contents and rinse lightly. • Labels and lids are “Plastic Containers and Packaging” not PET bottles. • If stains cannot be removed, dispose of the bottles as Burnable Garbage.
Hazardous Garbage 	★Dry-cell batteries ★Fluorescent lights ★Mercury Thermometers ★Small rechargeable batteries ★Small appliances with built-in rechargeable batteries Put the batteries into transparent bags 	• Place batteries, small rechargeable batteries, and small appliances with built-in rechargeable batteries in separate clear or white translucent bags and bundle them together for disposal. Insulate terminals, plugs, and charging ports with tape. • For products where the rechargeable batteries cannot be removed without disassembly, dispose of the entire product as hazardous garbage without removing the battery. • After removing the rechargeable battery, the main unit should be disposed of as “non-burnable garbage” or “Oversized Garbage.” • Fragile items such as fluorescent tubes and thermometers should be wrapped in paper and labeled “われもの(Fragile items)” before disposal.

<Rules for putting out garbage and recyclables>

1) Dispose of garbage by 8:45 a.m. on the collection day. 2) Keep your collection site clean together with your neighbors. 3) Call the Clean Center in advance to request collection of oversized garbage or large amounts at one time due to moving to a different residence. (Fees apply)
